3. Emergency Community Support Fund

To help the most vulnerable in our community's deal with the effects of COVID-19 the Government of Canada sponsored grants to be distributed by Community Foundations of Canada, United Way and The Red Cross organizations across Canada. Sussex Area Community Foundation was pleased to provide the following grants to the Sussex area to help with COVID-19 issues:

AX: Arts & Culture Centre Sussex received a grant to develop a series of online art programs including artist presentations, literary readings and live interactive workshops to allow vulnerable people in the community to engage in arts and cultural activities in the safety of their own home.

Community Action for Refugees Sussex received the following grants:

New families enjoying time at the Civic Centre.

Social: This project will provide 4 refugee families living in Sussex each with a family pass at the Nutrien Civic Centre to encourage social participation, physical activity, and mental health stimulation within a community environment.

Education: This project will provide the 4 refugee families living in Sussex each with a lap top computer in order to access online English classes, online school activities, and to better stay in touch with other community members through social media platforms.

Transportation: This project will increase opportunity for the 4 refugee families living in Sussex to travel to various appointments, school, work, socialize, etc. It will be accomplished in the short term with taxi vouchers and through out the longer term in driver education for 3 more individuals in the families.

Portage Atlantic: Portage is a not-for-profit organization whose primary mission is to help vulnerable people aged 14-21 struggling with substance abuse problems get rid of their addictions. This project would be to develop a hybrid virtual room for the Portage center in Cassidy Lake for residents.

Sussex and Area Seniors Centre: Update facility and activities to accommodate social distancing. The project will purchase of extra tables and an improved sound system that can be used on both floors at the same time.

Sussex Pregnancy Care Center: Will expand the wide range of streamed parenting education lessons can be done at home with the incentive of earning practical necessities for parents and their young children.
